## 6th international conference of young linguists „VIA SCIENTIARUM” general requirements for article submission and formalization

„VIA SCIENTIARUM” is a published collection of articles on issues of linguistics and other humanities studies, which research linguistic issues.

The article structure consists of a title, keywords (in one or several languages), main text and summary. Articles are published in Latvian, English, German or Russian languages. The article summary (in English, German or Russian) provides a short description of studied issues and main conclusions (title must be translated as well). The author is responsible for the language and validity of data in the submitted article and its summary.

The submitted articles are reviewed. Editor collegiate has a right to return insufficiently prepared articles or insufficiently justified studies to their authors with justified objections and recommendations for improvement.

The articles for the 6th edition of the „VIA SCIENTIARUM” article collection **must be submitted until the 31st of November, 2021**

Following requirements must be observed in formalization of the articles:

- the main text must be written in *Times New Roman* 14, list of literature and summary in foreign language – *Times New Roman* 12 with a single space between lines and paragraphs, .doc or .docx file format;
- university (scientific institution or other organization), where the author studies or works, must be indicated in the left side, below the author’s name and surname, in the brackets.
- article title must be written in capital letters and centred;
- tables, graphs, pictures must be in black and white (if such are not created by the author, a reference to the original source must be provided);
- Page margins: 2 cm from top and bottom, 2.5 cm from left and right side;
- article length (with list of literature and summary) – up to 15 pages.

Article references and citations must be formalized according to the standards of the Republic of Latvia ISO 690 and ISO 690-2.

References to sources, literature, digital and other sources must be included in the text in round brackets, for example, (Endzelīns 1951, 134) or (LVV 1987, 72) (number after the year of publishing is a page number).

List of literature must be ordered in alphabetical order with the abbreviation used in text first, for example:

- Ambrazas 2006 – Ambrazas, Vytautas. Lietuvių kalbos istorinė sintaksė. Vilnius: Lietuvių kalbos institutas, 2006.
- Endzelīns 1951 – Endzelīns, Jānis. Latviešu valodas gramatika. Rīga: Latvijas Valsts izdevniecība, 1951.
- Kalnača 2001 – Kalnača, Andra. Refleksīvie verbi un darbības vārda transitivitāte latviešu valodā. Vārds un tā pētīšanas aspekti: rakstu krājums, 5. Liepāja: LiePA, 2001, 198.–209. lpp.
- LVV 1987 – Latviešu valodas vārdnīca. Atbildīgā redaktore Dainuvīte Guļevska. Rīga: Avots, 1987.

In articles in Latvian language following quote marks must be used: „...”.
